HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Noxious Weeds Act 1950, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Noxious Weeds Act Extension Order 1956.
2. The First Schedule to the Noxious Weeds Act 1950 is hereby extended by including therein, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the words set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

ADDITIONAL PLANTS WHICH MAY BE DECLARED TO BE NOXIOUS WEEDS

Stinking mayweed (*Anthemis cotula*).

Giant buttercup (*Ranunculus acer*).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order adds stinking mayweed and giant buttercup to the list of plants which may be declared by a local authority to be noxious weeds.
