#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 8th day of December 1969

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 3 of the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Act 1965, and for the purpose of giving effect to the agreement defined in that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the New Zealand Australia Free Trade Agreement Order (No. 7) 1969.
  - (2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1970.
- 2. Tariff amended—The Customs Tariff (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966) is hereby amended by revoking the item and rates of duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, and substituting the items and rates of duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order is made for the purpose of giving effect to the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement signed on 31 August 1965. The effect is to reduce the rate of duty on battery operated clocks imported from Australia.

The order comes into effect on 1 January 1970.
