ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 26th day of June 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 3 of the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Act 1965, and for the purpose of giving effect to the agreement defined in that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Order (No. 3) 1972.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1972.

**2. Tariff amended**—The Customs Tariff is hereby amended by revoking the items, rates of duty, and exemption from duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, and substituting the items, rates of duty, and exemptions from duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

**3. Consequential revocations**—(1) The New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Order (No. 6) 1971\* is hereby amended by revoking so much of the Second Schedule as relates to items 71.16.009 and 97.06.029.

(2) The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 14) 1971† is hereby amended by revoking so much of the Second Schedule as relates to item 98.03.001.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order is made for the purpose of giving effect to the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement signed on 31 August 1965. The effect of the order is to reduce, from 1 July 1972, the rates of Customs duty on certain goods imported from Australia.

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Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 29 June 1972.

This order is administered in the Customs Department.
