THE NEW ZEALAND - AUSTRALIA FREE TRADE AGREEMENT ORDER (NO. 4) 1969

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of June 1969

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 3 of the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Act 1965, and for the purpose of giving effect to the agreement defined in that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Order (No. 4) 1969.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1969.

2. The Customs Tariff (as set out in the Second Schedule to the Customs Act 1966 and heretofore modified) is hereby amended by revoking the items and rates of duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, and substituting the items and rates of duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. (1) The Customs Tariff Amendment Order (No. 12) 1968* is hereby amended by revoking so much of the Second Schedule as relates to Chapter 36 and items 84.17.29, 98.10.01, and 98.10.09.

(2) The New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Order (No. 3) 1968[†] is hereby amended by revoking so much of the Second Schedule as relates to item 85.22.28.



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EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order is made for the purpose of giving effect to the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement signed on 31 August 1965. The effect is to reduce the rates of duty on certain goods from Australia.

The order comes into effect on 1 July 1969.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 12 June 1969. This order is administered in the Customs Department.
