Pursuant to section 3 of the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement Act 1965, and for the purpose of giving effect to the agreement defined in that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the New Zealand Australia Free Trade Agreement Order (No. 4) 1974.

 (2) This order shall come into force on 1 August 1974.
- 2. Tariff amended—The Customs Tariff is hereby amended by revoking the items and rates of duty specified in the First Schedule hereto, and substituting the items, rates of duty, and exemptions from duty specified in the Second Schedule hereto.
- **3. Consequential revocations**—The New Zealand Australia Free Trade Agreement Order (No. 3) 1974* is hereby amended by revoking so much of the Second Schedule as relates to Tariff items 84.59.123 and 97.06.052.

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order is made for the purpose of giving effect to the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement by exempting from duty sanitary units (water flushing or chemical] recirculating), hockey balls, softballs, and baseballs, when imported from Australia.

The order comes into force on 1 August 1974.
