### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 18th day of June 1990

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 4(1) of the Time Act 1974, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

---

### ORDER

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This order may be cited as the New Zealand Daylight Time Order 1990.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. New Zealand daylight time**—It is hereby declared that for the period commencing at 2 a.m. New Zealand standard time on the first Sunday of October in each year and ceasing at 2 a.m. New Zealand standard time on the third Sunday of March in the following year—

- (a) The time for general purposes in New Zealand, except for the Chatham Islands, shall be 1 hour in advance of New Zealand standard time; and
- (b) The time for general purposes in the Chatham Islands shall be 1 hour and 45 minutes in advance of New Zealand standard time.

**3. Revocation**—The New Zealand Daylight Time Order 1989\* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order declares that New Zealand daylight time is to be observed from 2 a.m. New Zealand standard time on the first Sunday of October in each year until 2 a.m. New Zealand standard time on the third Sunday of March in the following year.
