PURSUANT to the Plants Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. **Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1977.

2. **Chinese gooseberry inspection fee increased**—The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words “69.00c per tonne”, and substituting the words “\$1.03 per tonne”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations increase the inspection fee for chinese gooseberries (kiwi-fruit) from 69.00c per tonne to \$1.03 per tonne. The increase takes effect on 1 April 1977.
