# THE NEW ZEALAND GROWN FRUIT AND VEGETABLES REGULATIONS 1975, AMENDMENT NO. 4

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 25th day of September 1978

PURSUANT to the Plants Act 1970, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1978.

2. Abolition of inspection fees—(1) Regulation 37 of the principal

regulations is hereby revoked.

(2) The Second Schedule to the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1, and regulation 2 of the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 2) is hereby consequentially revoked.

(3) The New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1, and the New Zealand Grown Fruit and Vegetables Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 2, are hereby consequentially revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations abolish, on 1 October 1978, the inspection fees payable to the Crown in respect of inspections of apples, pears, and Chinese gooseberries (kiwifruit).
