**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

**ORDER**

1. This Order may be cited as the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act Extension Order 1943.

2. The disease known as bacterial-spot (*Bacterium pruni*) is hereby declared to be a disease within the meaning of the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928.

3. The First Schedule to the said Act is hereby extended by including therein the disease mentioned in clause 2 hereof.

4. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
