Pursuant to the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Onion Diseases Regulations 1951.
- 2. These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
 - 3. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Onions" includes all edible species of onion; but does not include onions preserved in pickle or otherwise manufactured:
 - "Sale" includes a contract for sale, agreement to sell, offer for sale, barter, and exchange.
- 4. No person shall consign or cause to be consigned any onions grown in the South Island for sale or delivery within the County of Franklin or the County of Horowhenua or the Borough of Pukekohe in the North Island; and no person shall accept delivery of any such onions in either of the said counties or in the said borough.
