THE OPTICIANS EMPLOYMENT ORDER 1944

Pursuant to Regulation 28 of the Industrial Man-power Emergency Regulations 1944,* the Minister of Industrial Man-power doth hereby make the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Opticians Employment Order 1944.
- (2) This Order shall come into force on the 21st day of September, 1944.

Obligations imposed on Registered Opticians

- 2. (1) Except as provided in the next succeeding subclause, every person who on the commencement of this Order is registered as an optician under the Opticians Act, 1928, shall, while this Order remains in force, continue to practise as an optician in the same place or places and in the same capacity as on the commencement of this Order.
- (2) Any person to whom this clause applies may, with the consent of the District Man-power Officer, but not otherwise—
 - (a) Cease to practise as an optician, either wholly or in any specified place or specified places; or
 - (b) Continue to practise as an optician in a capacity different from the capacity in which he is practising at the commencement of this Order; or
 - (c) Commence to practise as an optician at any other specified place or specified places.
- 3. (1) No person who becomes registered as an optician at any time after the commencement of this Order shall commence to practise as an optician in any capacity or in any place without the consent of the District Man-power Officer.
- (2) No person who, with the consent of the District Man-power Officer, hereafter commences to practise as an optician pursuant to the last preceding subclause shall thereafter cease to practise as an optician in accordance with the terms of that consent except with the jurther consent of the District Man-power Officer.
- 4. For the purposes of this Order the expression "to practise as an optician" has the same meaning as in the Opticians Act, 1928.

DIRECTION TO EMPLOYERS OF OPTICIANS

5. No person by whom any optician is for the time being employed shall, without the consent of the District Man-power Officer, terminate the employment or so alter the conditions thereof as to prevent or interfere with the carrying out by such optician of the obligations imposed on him by the foregoing provisions of this Order.
