**THE OIL FUEL EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1939,
AMENDMENT NO. 3.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 28th day of
February, 1940.

Present :

THE HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Oil Fuel Emergency Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Oil Fuel Emergency Regulations 1939 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.*

4. The principal regulations are amended by adding thereto the following additional regulations :—

“ 41. (1) The Controller may at any time require any person who is or has been the owner of any motor-vehicle to transmit to the Controller, or to any District Controller nominated by the Controller, the coupons issued in respect of that vehicle and not theretofore surrendered to a vendor, and may direct that no further coupons be issued to that person for a period or periods specified by the Controller.

“ (2) Within seven days after the sale or other disposal of any motor-vehicle the person selling or otherwise disposing of the same shall transmit to the Deputy Registrar of Motor-vehicles at whose office the motor-vehicle is then registered the coupons issued in respect of that vehicle and not theretofore surrendered to a vendor or to the Controller, together with such particulars of the motor-vehicle as are sufficient to identify it.

“ 42. On application by or on behalf of the owner of any motor-vehicle and on proof to the satisfaction of a District Controller by statutory declaration and such other evidence as he may require that the coupons theretofore issued in respect of that vehicle and not theretofore surrendered to a vendor or to the Controller have been lost or destroyed, and on payment of a fee of 5s., the District Controller may at any time issue to the owner coupons in substitution for those lost or destroyed.

“ 43. Every person who, not being entitled to the possession of coupons in terms of these regulations, tenders a coupon to a vendor for the purpose of obtaining oil fuel, commits an offence against these regulations.”
