**THE ORGANIC FERTILIZER SUPPLY REGULATIONS 1952,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 19th day of November 1952

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fertilizers Act 1927, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Organic Fertilizer Supply Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Organic Fertilizer Supply Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 5, the following regulation:—

“5A. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of these regulations, the Minister of Agriculture may, by notice published in the *Gazette*, authorize the supply, acquisition, and use of organic fertilizer for topdressing during such period as may be specified in the notice, and either generally throughout New Zealand or in such part or parts thereof as may be specified in the notice.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

These regulations enable the Minister to relax the prohibition contained in the principal regulations in respect of the supply, acquisition, and use of organic fertilizers for topdressing as circumstances warrant.
