## HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to Part III of the Ozone Layer Protection Act 1996, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister for the Environment whose recommendation has been made—

- (a) After consultation by that Minister in accordance with section 17 of that Act: and
- (b) After being satisfied that, after making the regulations, New Zealand will be able to give effect to its obligations under the Convention and the Protocol,—

hereby makes the following regulations.

## **REGULATIONS**

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Ozone Layer Protection Regulations 1996, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Ozone Layer Protection Regulations 1996\* (in these regulations referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January

2. Base year permits for methyl bromide—Regulation 6 (3) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding, to the reduction timetable, the following:

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1997, set a zero percent reduction timetable for 1997 for methyl bromide. The effect is that "base year" import permits for methyl bromide will continue to be calculated on the applicant's 1991 consumption of methyl bromide. The rules relating to quarantine and pre-shipment permits are unaffected.
