ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 22nd day of October, 1941.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Opticians Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Opticians Regulations 1930, Amendment No. 4.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Opticians Regulations 1930* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 6th day of

October, 1941.

- 4. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is amended—
- (1) By revoking the words "at least" in clause (2) thereof; and

(2) By adding thereto the following additional clause:—

- "(9) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing clauses of this regulation, the Board may, in any case in which it thinks fit so to do, grant permission to any person to present himself for examination in the subjects of Section A after he has undergone training for a period of not less than nine months. In each such case the period shall be specified by the Board, and the period so specified shall be computed as one year's training for all the purposes of this regulation."
- 5. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the figure "5" after the word "Regulation" in clause (5), and substituting the figure "6".
