THE OPOSSUM REGULATIONS 1934, AMENDMENT NO. 4

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of
May, 1942.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Opossum Regulations 1934, Amendment No. 4.
2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Opossum Regulations 1934* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
3. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations, as replaced by Regulation 3 of the Opossum Regulations 1934, Amendment No. 3, is amended by adding thereto the following:—

“*Urban Areas in the Wellington Acclimatization District.*—All those areas included within the boundaries of the Cities of Wellington, Lower Hutt, and Palmerston North, the Boroughs of Taihape, Marton, Feilding, Foxton, Pahiatua, Eketahuna, Masterton, Carterton, Greytown, Martinborough, Featherston, Upper Hutt, Petone, Eastbourne, Otaki, Levin, and Shannon, and the Town Districts of Mangaweka, Hunterville, Bulls, and Johnsonville.”
