THE OPTICIANS REGULATIONS 1966, AMENDMENT NO. 2

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 20th day of May 1974

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Opticians Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Opticians Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Opticians Regulations 1966* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Qualifications that may be recognised—The Third Schedule to the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 4 of the Opticians Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 1) is hereby further amended by adding the following qualification:

“Diploma in Applied Science (Optometry) of the Queensland Institute of Technology.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The Diploma in Applied Science (Optometry) of the Queensland Institute of Technology is declared to be a qualification that may be recognised by the Opticians Board as sufficient for the purposes of the Opticians Act 1928.
