## THE OCCUPATIONAL RE-ESTABLISHMENT EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 1.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of June, 1941.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Occupational Re-establishment Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and be deemed part of the Occupational Re-establishment Emergency Regulations

1940\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding to the definition of "military service" in Regulation 2 thereof the following words: "and whether such Forces be raised in New Zealand or by the Government of any territory forming part of His Majesty's dominions, or continuous whole-time service as a radio operator in a ship to which the Shipping and Seamen Act Wireless Regulations 1925 apply (including any period of training for service as such an operator) where the service as operator or trainee commenced after the 19th day of February, 1941, or hereafter commences, and terminates not later than the end of the duration of the war in which His Majesty is now engaged or as soon thereafter as the contract of service may lawfully be determined".
