



**THE OCCUPATIONAL RE-ESTABLISHMENT EMERGENCY
REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 1st day of
July, 1942.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Occupational Re-establishment Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Occupational Re-establishment Emergency Regulations 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

“ 13. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act or regulations thereunder or in any award or industrial agreement under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, or in any other voluntary agreement affecting conditions of employment, if an employee has commenced or at any time hereafter commences any period of military service, and has returned or at any time hereafter returns to his regular employment within a period of six months, every such period of absence from his regular employment shall, up to an aggregate maximum period of six months in any year of his civil employment, be regarded as time served under his contract of service in civil employment :

“ Provided that in respect of any such period of absence from employment as aforesaid the parties to the contract shall be relieved of all their obligations under the contract which relate to the following matters—that is to say, the payment of remuneration, the performance of work, or the provision of work or instruction.”
