THE RIGHT HON. R. D. MULDOON PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Occupational Therapy Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Occupational Therapy Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Occupational Therapy Regulations 1964* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of March 1977.

2. Fees—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 21, and substituting the following regulation:

“21. (1) The fee for examination under section 10 (2) of the Act shall be \$10:

“Provided that no fee shall be payable under this subclause where the examination is conducted otherwise than by the Board and any other fee is payable by the applicant in respect of the examination.

“(2) The fee for registration shall be \$20:

“Provided that no fee shall be payable under this subclause by an applicant who is already registered as an occupational therapist according to law in any overseas country and who is temporarily

employed in a hospital in New Zealand on exchange, for not more than 12 months, with an occupational therapist who is registered in New Zealand and who is not charged a fee for registration in that overseas country.

“(3) The fee for the issue of a certificate of registration shall be \$3.

“(4) The fee for the issue of an annual practising certificate shall be \$8.

“(5) The fee for the restoration of a name to the register, pursuant to an application under section 16 (4) of the Act, shall be \$5.

“(6) The fee for the correction of a name in the register, pursuant to an application under subsection (2) of section 18 of the Act (not being a case to which the proviso to that subsection applies), shall be \$5.

“(7) All fees shall be paid at the time of application.”

(2) The following regulations are hereby consequentially revoked:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Occupational Therapy Regulations 1964.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement. The regulations come into force on the 1st day of March 1977.

Regulation 2 substitutes a new (and, in general, increased) scale of fees in respect of the various matters specified in the regulation. For the first time a fee is prescribed for the correction of a name in the Register of Occupational Therapists pursuant to an application under section 18 (2) of the Act.
