



**THE OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY REGULATIONS 1964,
AMENDMENT NO. 8**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 10th day of June 1985

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. DAVID LANGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 32 (2) (e) of the Occupational Therapy Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Occupational Therapy Regulations 1964, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Occupational Therapy Regulations 1964* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1985.

2. Fees—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 21, and substituting the following regulation:

“21. (1) The fee for examination under section 10 (2) of the Act shall be \$100; except that in the case of an examination conducted otherwise than by the board and for which any other fee is payable by the applicant, in which case no fee shall be payable under this subclause.

“(2) The fee for registration shall be \$35; except in the case of an application for registration by an applicant who is registered as an occupational therapist in any other country, and who is temporarily employed in a hospital in New Zealand on exchange for not more than 12 months with an occupational therapist who is registered in New Zealand, and who is not charged a fee for registration in that overseas country, in which case no fee shall be payable under this subclause.

“(3) The fee for the issue of a certificate of registration shall be \$5.

“(4) The fee for the issue of an annual practising certificate shall be \$30.

“(5) The fee for the restoration of a name to the register, pursuant to an application under section 16 (4) of the Act, shall be \$25.

“(6) The fee for the correction of a name in the register, pursuant to an application under section 18 (2) of the Act (not being a case to which the proviso to that subsection applies), shall be \$5.”

(2) Notwithstanding regulation 21 (4) of the principal regulations (as substituted by subclause (1) of this regulation) the fee for the issue of an annual practising certificate in respect of the year ending with the 31st day of March 1986 shall be \$16.

3. Revocations—The following regulations are hereby consequentially revoked:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1985, increase the fees payable in respect of various matters under the Occupational Therapy Regulations 1964. Despite the increases, the fee for an annual practising certificate in respect of the year ending 31 March 1986 remains at \$16, which is the fee that was payable before these regulations came into force.
