PURSUANT to the Poultry Act, 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

# ORDER.

1. This Order may be cited as the Poultry Diseases Order 1941.

2. The Orders in Council mentioned in the First Schedule hereto are revoked.

3. The diseases affecting poultry mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be diseases within the meaning of the Poultry Act, 1924.

4. This Order in Council shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.\*
