

#### THE POLICE FORCE PAY REGULATIONS 1955

# C. W. M. NORRIE, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of July 1955

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Police Force Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Force Pay Regulations 1955.
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1954.
- 2. The rates of pay and allowances payable to members of the Police Force in respect of the period commencing on the 1st day of October 1954 and ending on the 17th day of November 1954 shall be those set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. The rates of pay and allowances payable to members of the Police Force after the 17th day of November 1954 shall be those set out in the Second Schedule hereto.
- 4. Where any member of the Force serving as a radio technician is promoted to a higher grade of any rank, he shall be entitled to the pay and allowances appropriate to that grade notwithstanding that he has not served the period of time indicated in the First or Second Schedule hereto as appropriate to that grade.
- 5. Where a member of the Force of any rank is provided free of charge in respect of his employment with lodging for himself or his family or with the use of a house or is, under the authority of these regulations, paid an allowance instead of being so provided with lodging or with the use of a house, then, notwithstanding any other provision of these regulations, the annual value of those benefits for the purposes of section 55 of the Superannuation Act 1947 is hereby declared to be the appropriate sum set out in the Third Schedule hereto.
- 6. The regulations specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
