

THE POLICE FORCE PAY REGULATIONS 1957

C. W. M. NORRIE, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of March 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Police Force Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Police Force Pay Regulations 1957.
- (2) These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th day of November 1956.
 - 2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Constable" includes a Detective:
 - "Senior Sergeant" includes a Senior Detective:
 - "Sergeant" includes a Detective Sergeant.
- 3. The rates of pay and allowances payable to members of the Police Force on and from the 19th day of November 1956 shall be those set out in the Schedule hereto.
- 4. The Commissioner may direct that any Constable, who is over the age of twenty-one years and on his appointment to the Force has special qualifications or has had special experience fitting him for duties as a member of the Force, shall be paid a commencing salary of £880 or £905, and any such Constable shall, for the purposes of payment in accordance with these regulations, be deemed to have had one, or as the case may be, two years' service as a member of the Force.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything in regulation 3 hereof, a Constable who entered the primary course at the Police Training School on or after the 1st day of February 1956, and who is not a radio technician, shall not receive a greater salary than £905 a year until he has completed to the satisfaction of the Commissioner or of some person nominated in that behalf by the Commissioner a correspondence course of instruction relating to the duties of members of the Force and has completed a second course at the Police Training School:

Provided that for special reasons the Commissioner may direct that subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, this regulation shall not apply to any Constable.

- 6. (1) A Constable who is promoted to the rank of Sergeant on or after the 1st day of April 1956, and who on the date of his promotion has completed not less than nine years' service in the Force, shall for the purposes of payment in accordance with these regulations be deemed on the date of his promotion to have served for one year as a Sergeant.
- (2) A Sergeant who on the 1st day of April 1956 had completed not less than nine years' service in the Force shall on that date be deemed, for the purposes of payment in accordance with these regulations, to have served for not less than one year as a Sergeant.
- (3) A Sergeant who after the 1st day of April 1956 completes nine years' service in the Force shall for the purposes of payment in accordance with these regulations be deemed on completion of nine years' service to have served for not less than one year as a Sergeant.
- (4) In the application of this regulation to any person becoming a member of the Force on or after the 1st day of April 1956, or to any person who became a member of the Force before that date and was under the age of twenty-one years on the 31st day of March 1956, the expression "service" shall be deemed not to include any period of service during which that person was under that age.
- (5) Unless the Commissioner otherwise directs, nothing in this regulation shall apply to any person appointed a Sergeant, in an acting or temporary capacity, pursuant to subsection (2) of section 8c of the Police Force Act 1947.
 - 7. The Police Force Pay Regulations 1956* are hereby revoked.
