ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 19th day of June 1989

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 7 of the Pesticides Act 1979, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Agriculture tendered on the recommendation of the Pesticides Board, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Pesticide (Antifouling Paints) Order 1989.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1989.

2. Certain paints to be pesticides—Every paint that contains a substance or a mixture of substances that is intended for use in the control of fouling organisms on boat hulls or other underwater structures is hereby declared to be a pesticide for the purposes of the Pesticides Act 1979.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This note declares antifouling paints used for boat hulls and underwater structures to be pesticides within the meaning of the Pesticides Act 1979.
