## THE PHARMACY REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 4

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 8th day of  
September, 1948

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Pharmacy Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in accordance with recommendations made by the Pharmacy Board of New Zealand and transmitted by the Board to the Minister of Health, doth hereby make the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Pharmacy Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pharmacy Regulations 1944\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1948.

3. Regulation 37 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted :—

“ 37. (1) The percentages hereinafter stated are percentages of the maximum marks for the subject or subjects in question.

“ (2) In the Section B Examination :—

“ (a) A candidate must obtain at least 50 per cent. in Botany, and an average of at least 50 per cent. in the three Chemistry subjects to gain a full pass :

“ (b) If a candidate obtains at least 50 per cent. in Botany, and an average of at least 30 per cent. but less than 50 per cent. in the three Chemistry subjects, he shall be credited with a partial pass in Botany and may gain a full pass by obtaining at least 50 per cent. in the three Chemistry subjects at a later examination :

“(c) If a candidate obtains an average of at least 50 per cent. in the three Chemistry subjects and at least 30 per cent. but less than 50 per cent. in Botany, he shall be credited with a partial pass in the three Chemistry subjects and may gain a full pass by obtaining at least 50 per cent. in Botany at a later examination.

“(3) In the Section C Examination no averaging of marks shall be permitted and no partial pass shall be granted, and a candidate must obtain at least 50 per cent. in each of the four subjects at the one examination to gain a pass.”
