THE PARLIAMENTARY SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES DETERMINATION 1978, AMENDMENT NO. 1

PURSUANT to section 27 of the Civil List Act 1950 and to the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977, the Higher Salaries Commission hereby makes the following determination.

DETERMINATION

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This determination may be cited as the Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Determination 1978, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Determination 1978* (hereinafter referred to as the principal determination).
- (2) This determination shall be deemed to have come into force on the 8th day of December 1978.
- 2. Salaries—(1) The principal determination is hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to this determination.
 - (2) Clause 2 (2) of the principal determination is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the determination, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This determination, which is deemed to have come into force on 8 December 1978, increases parliamentary salaries.

It makes two separate adjustments which match adjustments being granted to State servants.

The first adjustment of 10.4 percent is retrospective to 8 December 1978.

The second adjustment of 4.5 percent takes effect on 3 September 1979.

The amount of \$365 a year (which has been payable by virtue of the application of the 1978 general wage order) ceases to be payable as an allowance and is incorporated into the rates fixed by this determination.
