ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 3rd day of September 1952

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to the Rabbit Nuisance Act 1928, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rabbit Destruction Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 11, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rabbit Destruction Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 2 of the Rabbit Destruction Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 9, is hereby amended by inserting therein, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the following items:—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

These regulations add the Orepuki, Pourakino, and Waimatuku Rabbit Boards to the list of Boards which have power to control the trapping, shooting, hunting, &c., of rabbits in their districts.
