HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Rabbit Nuisance Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rabbit Destruction Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rabbit Destruction Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting therein, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the following items :—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

The effect of these regulations is to confer on the Rabbit Boards referred to in regulation 2 in respect of their respective districts the powers already possessed by a number of Rabbit Boards under the principal regulations to restrict and control the trapping, shooting, hunting, &c., of rabbits in their respective districts.
