REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Rabbit Destruction Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rabbit Destruction Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

EXPLANATORY NOTE
