THE REHABILITATION EXTENSION ORDER, 1937

Enacting authority : His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.
Act pursuant to which the regulations were made : Section 9 of the
Mortgagors and Lessees Rehabilitation Act, 1936.

Date on which the regulations were made : 6th day of January, 1937.

Date of notification in *Gazette* : 8th day of January, 1937.

1. This Order may be cited as the Rehabilitation Extension Order, 1937.

2. The provisions of the Mortgagors and Lessees Rehabilitation Act, 1936, are hereby extended so that the provisions of that Act shall apply to the instruments particularly referred to in the Schedule hereto as if such instruments were leases within the meaning of the said Act, and as if the royalties or other moneys payable thereunder were rent.

SCHEDULE.

PARTICULAR INSTRUMENTS TO WHICH THE PROVISIONS OF THE MORTGAGORS AND LESSEES REHABILITATION ACT, 1936, ARE HEREBY APPLIED.

(1) Memorandum of lease from Alexander Wyllie Rodger to the **Wairaki Coal Company, Limited**, dated the 1st day of March, 1924, and registered in the Lands Registry Office at Invercargill under number 7248.

(2) Memorandum of lease from Eliza Mills to the **Wairaki Coal Company, Limited**, dated the 4th day of October, 1927, and registered in the Lands Registry Office at Invercargill under number 7642.

(3) Agreement dated the 20th day of March, 1936, expressed to be made between one Eliza Mills of the one part and the **Wairaki Coal Company, Limited**, of the other part.

(4) Instrument of license bearing date the 11th day of November, 1926, given by the Native Trustee in favour of one Leo Carroll and one Katherine Cecilia Bourke for the cutting and removal of flax affecting part of Poukawa No. 13 Block, being part of the land comprised in certificate of title recorded in the Hawke's Bay District Land Registry in Register Book Volume 48, folio 268.
