ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 3rd day of December 1957

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within Hong Kong of judgments given in the superior Courts of New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments (Hong Kong) Order 1957.
2. Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934 shall extend to Hong Kong.
3. The Supreme Court of Hong Kong shall be deemed to be the superior Court of Hong Kong for the purposes of Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934.
