HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within Pakistan of judgments given in the superior Courts of New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. This order may be cited as the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments (Pakistan) Order 1958.
- 2. Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934 shall extend to Pakistan.
- 3. The Supreme Court of Pakistan, the High Court for the Province of West Pakistan, the High Court for the Province of East Pakistan, and all Pakistan district and other Courts where civil jurisdiction is subject to no pecuniary limit, shall be deemed to be superior Courts of Pakistan for the purposes of Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934.
