ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 19th day of September 1988

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within Tonga of judgments given in the superior Courts of New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments (Tonga) Order 1988.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Application to Tonga—Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934 shall extend to Tonga.
- **3. Superior Courts**—The Privy Council of Tonga and the Supreme Court of Tonga shall be deemed to be superior Courts of Tonga for the purposes of Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934.

This order enables judgments given in the superior Courts of Tonga to be enforced in New Zealand in terms of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934.
