

THE RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT OF JUDGMENTS (WESTERN SAMOA) ORDER 1971

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that substantial reciprocity of treatment will be assured as respects the enforcement within Western Samoa of judgments given in the superior Courts of New Zealand, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title—This order may be cited as the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments (Western Samoa) Order 1971.
- 2. Application to Western Samoa—Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934 shall extend to Western Samoa.
- **3. Superior Courts**—The Supreme Court of Western Samoa and the Court of Appeal of Western Samoa shall be deemed to be superior Courts of Western Samoa for the purposes of Part I of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order enables judgments given in superior Courts of Western Samoa to be enforced in New Zealand in terms of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act 1934.
