THE HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Supply Regulations Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking Regulation 17C, as substituted by Regulation 6 of the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942, Amendment No. 3.

(2) Regulation 6 of the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942, Amendment No. 3, is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

These regulations abolish the rationing of cream, by revoking the regulation that prohibited the use or consumption of cream, or its supply to consumers, without a permit from the Rationing Controller.
