THE REGISTRATION FOR EMPLOYMENT ORDER NO. 9

PURSUANT to Regulation 30 of the Industrial Man-power Emergency Regulations 1942,* the Minister of Industrial Man-power doth hereby order and direct as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Registration for Employment Order No. 9.

2. Subject to the exemptions hereinafter specified, every woman who at the date of this Order is a member of the General Reserve constituted by Regulation 5 of the National Service Emergency Regulations 1940†, and has attained the age of thirty-one years but has not attained the age of forty-one years shall, within fourteen days after the date of this Order, register for employment by completing a form provided for the purpose and delivering it to a District Man-power Officer either personally or by registered post.

3. Subject to the exemptions hereinafter specified, every woman who at any time after the date of this Order becomes a member of the General Reserve and at that time has attained the age of thirty-one years but has not attained the age of forty-one years shall within fourteen days thereafter register for employment in the manner prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

4. Subject to the exemptions hereinafter specified, every woman who at any time after the date of this Order attains the age of thirty-one years and at that time is a member of the General Reserve shall within fourteen days thereafter register for employment in the manner prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

5. Every woman who for the time being belongs to any one or more of the classes specified in the Schedule hereto shall be exempt from compliance with clause 2 or clause 3 or clause 4 of this Order.

6. If at any time after the date of this Order any woman ceases to be exempted under the last preceding clause from compliance with clause 2 or clause 3 or clause 4 of this Order, she shall within fourteen days thereafter register for employment in the manner prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

SCHEDULE

EXEMPTIONS

PERSONS registered for the purposes of Regulation 30 of the Industrial Man-power Emergency Regulations 1942.

Persons rendering continuous service as members of any of His Majesty's naval, military, or air forces.

Persons employed as civilians by the Royal New Zealand Navy, the Army Department, or the Royal New Zealand Air Force.

Full-time employees of registered hospitals.

Married women with children under sixteen years of age whose domestic responsibilities include the care of their children.

Persons who are outside of New Zealand.

Persons in receipt of invalids' benefits under the Social Security Act, 1938.

Inmates of any hospital or of the New Zealand Institute for the Blind.

Persons in respect of whom reception-orders are in force under the Mental Defectives Act, 1911 (whether or not they are detained in institutions under the Act) or who are detained as voluntary boarders under that Act.

Persons undergoing sentences of imprisonment or detained in Borstal Institutions.
