## THE ROCK LOBSTER REGULATIONS 1969, AMENDMENT NO. 6

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

- 1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Rock Lobster Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rock Lobster Regulations 1969\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Special provisions relating to the taking of rock lobsters off Otago—Regulation 6 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Rock Lobster Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 3, and amended by regulation 2 of the Rock Lobster Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 4, and by regulation 2 of the Rock Lobster Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 5) is hereby further amended by revoking paragraph (b) of subclause (2) and substituting the following paragraph:

"(b) The rock lobster is taken during the period commencing with the 1st day of June 1975 and ending with the 19th day of December 1975, and the tail of that rock lobster is not less

than 5 in. in length; or"

EXPLANATORY NOTE This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Rock Lobster Regulations 1969.

The effect of the amendment is to allow rock lobsters having tails not less than 5 in. in length to be taken off Otago within the period 1 June 1975 to 19 December 1975 thereby extending the season by 3 weeks.
