THE ROYAL NEW ZEALAND AIR FORCE PAY AND ALLOW-**ANCES EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1946**

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Royal New Zealand Air Force Pav and Allowances Emergency Regulations 1946.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,— "Child" means any child who has not attained the age of sixteen years, and includes any step-child, adopted child, or illegitimate child who has not attained that age:

"Dependant," in relation to any member, means the wife or any child of the member, or any other person who in the opinion of the Minister is wholly or partly dependent upon

or has a claim for maintenance against the member:

"Permanent member" means any member who was appointed to a commission or enlisted in the Air Force before the 4th day of September, 1939, and who was serving on the active list on that date; but does not include any member of the Territorial Air Force:

"Temporary member" means any member of the Air Force

who is not a permanent member:

"Wife", in relation to any member, includes any woman with whom that member was living during the whole of the period of one year immediately preceding the commencement of continuous service by that member in any of His Majesty's Forces, and who was during that period publicly represented as the wife of that member:

Expressions defined in the Royal New Zealand Air Force Regulations 1938* have the meanings so defined.

PROVISIONS OF THE ROYAL NEW ZEALAND AIR FORCE REGULATIONS 1938 AFFECTED BY THESE REGULATIONS

3. (1) While these regulations continue in force the following provisions of the Royal New Zealand Air Force Regulations 1938* (in this regulation referred to as the existing regulations) shall have no application, namely :-

(a) Regulation 144 (2) (b) (which relates to pay of airmen on reclassification, remustering, or promotion):

(b) Subdivisions A, B, and C of Regulation 146†, and Regulation 147 (which relate to pay of officers and airmen):

(c) Regulation 148 (which relates to forfeiture of airmen's pay):

(d) Regulation 151, as amended by Regulation 7 of the Royal New Zealand Air Force Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 5t, and Regulation 152, as amended by Regulation 3 of the Royal New Zealand Air Force Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 3§ (which regulations relate to quarters and rations and to special pay):

(e) Regulation 190|| (which relates to Chaplains' allowances):

(f) Regulation 202 (which relates to funerals).

(2) While these regulations continue in force, Regulations 184 to 186 of the existing regulations (which relate to pay and allowances of members while abroad or proceeding overseas) shall, except in so far as the Air Board specifically approves their application with respect to any particular case or cases, have no application.

(3) While these regulations continue in force, Regulations 210 to 214 of the existing regulations (which relate to gratuities) shall apply with respect to permanent members, but shall not otherwise apply.

(4) Except where otherwise specially provided, the remaining provisions of the existing regulations shall be read subject to the provisions of these regulations.

Application of these Regulations

4. (1) Except where otherwise specially provided, these regulations shall apply with respect to all members of the Air Force other than members of the Women's Auxiliary Air Force constituted under the Women's Auxiliary Air Force Emergency Regulations 1942¶.

(2) While any member of any of His Majesty's Forces is attached or on loan to the Air Force, or is seconded for service with the Air Force, these regulations shall, subject to any special provisions agreed upon between the authorities concerned, apply with respect to that member as if he were a member of the Air Force.

STANDARD AND SUPPLEMENTED RATES OF PAY

5. (1) The minimum annual rate (including the annual increments) at which a member shall be paid (hereinafter referred to as the standard rate) shall be the appropriate rate, having regard to the rank or classification of the member, prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.

(2) The standard rate of pay of a member having a dependant or dependants may be supplemented to such annual rate as the Minister may determine (hereinafter referred to as the supplemented rate),

being not more than the sum of the appropriate basic rate for such member as prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto and an amount, not exceeding the appropriate amount prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto, allowable in respect of each such dependant as aforesaid.

(3) For the purposes of this regulation the term "child", where used in the Third Schedule hereto, shall be deemed to include any child of the member who, not having attained the age of eighteen years, is being maintained by the member and is attending day school for full-time instruction; and every such child as aforesaid shall accordingly be deemed to be a dependant of the member.

(4) The supplemented rate of pay of a member shall be calculated

to the nearest pound.

PAY AND ALLOWANCES FOR TEMPORARY AND ACTING RANK

6. (1) Every member holding temporary rank shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (4) of Subdivision D of Regulation 146 of the Royal New Zealand Air Force Regulations 1938,* be paid and granted pay and allowances at the rates prescribed by these regulations in respect of members of the equivalent substantive rank.

(2) Any member may be granted acting rank and may, with the approval of the Minister, after serving for twenty-one days in that rank be paid and granted, on and from the date on which that rank was granted, pay and allowances at the rates applicable to members

of the equivalent temporary rank:

Provided that no member serving in acting rank in receipt of pay pursuant to this subclause shall be entitled to any annual increments of pay to which a member of equivalent temporary rank would be entitled, or to any seniority by virtue of his having so served if he is subsequently promoted to equivalent temporary rank.

PAY OF AIRMAN APPOINTED TO A COMMISSION

7. (1) Every airman appointed to a commission shall on appointment receive pay at a rate not less than the rate to which he was entitled under these regulations immediately before his appointment.

(2) Any warrant officer appointed to a commission may be granted pay in the appropriate branch in accordance with the following

scale :-

(a) If he has served for at least two years and for less than three years as a warrant officer, he may be paid at the standard rate, or, as the case may require, the supplemented rate, applicable to a flying officer (2nd year), and shall thereafter receive the appropriate annual increments:

(b) If he has served for not less than three years as a warrant officer, he may be paid at the standard rate, or, as the case may require, the supplemented rate, applicable to a flying officer (3rd year), and shall thereafter receive the appro-

priate annual increments.

MINIMUM RATE OF PAY FOR MARRIED MEMBERS

8. Subject to such conditions as may from time to time be determined by the Air Board, pay at the rate of not less than £185 per annum may be granted to any member who on the 15th day of January, 1943, was a married member.

PAY AND ALLOWANCES OF YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVES

- **9.** (1) Every representative of the Young Men's Christian Association duly appointed for service with the Air Force shall be enlisted and shall receive the pay and allowances of an aircraftman, 2nd class, of equivalent domestic status.
- (2) Every such representative as aforesaid shall receive a free issue of clothes and equipment in accordance with such scales as may from time to time be determined by the Air Board.
- (3) Every senior secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association posted for duty overseas shall, on and from the day of his departure from New Zealand until the day before the date of his arrival in New Zealand (on returning to New Zealand), receive the basic rate of pay of a Warrant Officer (2nd year), together with the appropriate dependants' allowances.

Domestic Allowance

- 10. (1) While any member maintains his wife and any child of the member under the wife's care, or maintains his divorced wife and any child of the member under the divorced wife's care, there may, in the discretion of the Minister, be paid to the wife or, as the case may require, to the divorced wife an annual allowance (hereinafter referred to as a domestic allowance) not exceeding in any case the sum of £45 12s. 6d. per annum.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, while any member maintains his wife and any child of the member who is under the wife's care and has not attained the age of eighteen years, or maintains his divorced wife and any child of the member who is under the divorced wife's care and has not attained the age of eighteen years, and while the child continues to attend day school for full-time instruction, there may, if the Minister or any person authorized in that behalf by the Minister so directs, be paid to the wife or, as the case may require, to the divorced wife a domestic allowance not exceeding in any case the sum of £45 12s. 6d. per annum.
- (3) The domestic allowance provided for by this regulation may in any particular case or cases, if the Minister so directs, and subject to such conditions as the Minister from time to time prescribes, be paid to the guardian of any child of a member who is a widower, or who is separated from his wife in circumstances which make it necessary for him to have the custody of the child.
- (4) On the death of any child in respect of whom a domestic allowance is payable under or by virtue of this regulation the allowance shall continue to be payable, after the death of the child, until the 15th day or, as the case may require, the last day of the month in which the child dies.

SPECIAL ALLOWANCE

11. (1) While any member maintains his wife or his divorced wife, there may, in the discretion of the Minister, be paid to the wife or, as the case may require, to the divorced wife an annual allowance (hereinafter referred to as a special allowance) not exceeding in any case the sum of £9 2s. 6d. per annum.

- (2) While any member maintains his wife and any child of the member under the wife's care, or maintains his divorced wife and any child of the member under the divorced wife's care, there may, in the discretion of the Minister, be paid to the wife or, as the case may require, to the divorced wife a special allowance not exceeding in any case the sum of £18 5s. per annum.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, while any member maintains his wife and any child of the member who is under the wife's care and has not attained the age of eighteen years, or maintains his divorced wife and any child of the member who is under the divorced wife's care and has not attained the age of eighteen years, and while the child continues to attend day school for full-time instruction, there may, if the Minister or any person authorized in that behalf by the Minister so directs, be paid to the wife or, as the case may require, to the divorced wife a special allowance not exceeding in any case the sum of £18 5s. per annum.
- (4) On the death of any child in respect of whom a special allowance is payable under or by virtue of this regulation the allowance shall continue to be payable, after the death of the child, until the 15th day or, as the case may require, the last day of the month in which the child dies.

COMMENCEMENT OF SUPPLEMENTED RATE OF PAY, DOMESTIC ALLOWANCE, AND SPECIAL ALLOWANCE

12. Where application for a supplemented rate of pay or for a domestic allowance or special allowance is made within a period of six months from the date on which the member or, as the case may be, the wife or divorced wife or guardian became eligible for such rate or allowance, payment may be made as from that date. If application is not made within the aforesaid period of six months, the date from which payment is to commence shall be determined by the Minister.

PAY, DOMESTIC ALLOWANCE, AND SPECIAL ALLOWANCE WHERE MEMBER REPORTED MISSING OR DEAD

- 13. (1) Where any member is reported either missing or dead on service within New Zealand and the casualty is established as attributable to or aggravated by such service, or where any member is reported either missing or dead on service beyond New Zealand, there shall, for a period of three months from the date of the notification of the casualty, be paid to the next-of-kin of the member pay at the appropriate rate applicable to that member at the date of the casualty.
- (2) In any other case where a member is reported missing or dead such portion only of his pay as is sufficient to pay any allotment made by him for the benefit of a dependant shall continue to be paid until the expiration of three months from the date of the notification of the casualty or until the death of such dependant, whichever is the earlier.
- (3) If in any case to which this regulation applies a domestic allowance or a special allowance is being paid, the allowance shall continue to be paid for any period during which pay or any portion of the pay of the member continues to be paid in accordance with this regulation.

(4) The payments referred to in this regulation shall continue to be made during the aforesaid period of three months, notwithstanding the re-marriage or any other change of circumstances of any dependant.

SEPARATION ALLOWANCE

14. (1) Where any member who on the 15th day of January, 1943, was a married member is required to live on a station, he may be paid a separation allowance at a rate not exceeding £45 per annum:

Provided—

(a) That payment of the allowance shall be subject to such conditions as the Minister may determine; and

- (b) That the actual pay and allowances (including the separation allowance) payable to the member shall not exceed the total pay and allowances which were payable to him on the 15th day of January, 1943, or which would have been payable to him had he been living on a station at that date.
- (2) A separation allowance payable to a member under this regulation shall, for the purposes of these regulations, be deemed to form part of the pay of that member.

DUTY PAY

- 15. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, there shall, in addition to the appropriate standard rate of pay, be payable to airmen duty pay at the following rates:—
 - (a) Cook's pay at the rate of 1s. 6d. per day to a chief cook and 1s. per day to an assistant cook:
 - (b) Driver's pay at the rate of 6d. per day to a driver, petrol, increased to 1s. per day after satisfactory service for one year in the rank of aircraftman, or upon classification as leading aircraftman:

(c) Plant operator's pay at the rate of 1s. per day:

- (d) Safety equipment assistant's pay at the rate of 1s. per day:
- (e) Technical instructor's pay, subject to the prior approval of the Air Board, at the rate of 1s. per day.
- (2) Duty pay shall be paid to an airman only while he is detailed for any of the above-mentioned duties. While so detailed the airman shall be paid duty pay during any period of temporary absence not exceeding fourteen days, occasioned by—
 - (a) Absence or employment on other duty:

(b) Leave, other than leave without pay:

(c) Sick-leave, not due to the airman's own misconduct or neglect:

Provided that the Air Board may in any particular case authorize the payment of duty pay otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this clause.

(3) For the purposes of this regulation the expressions "chief cook", "driver, petrol", "plant operator", "safety equipment assistant", and "technical instructor" shall have the meanings from time to time assigned thereto by the Air Board.

ALLOTMENT OF PAY

16. (1) There may from time to time be deducted from the pay of any member such amount as the Minister may deem necessary for the support of any dependant or dependants of the member, or for any

other special purpose approved by the Minister, and any amount so deducted may, as the Minister thinks fit, be allotted and paid to such dependant or dependants as aforesaid or to some other person on behalf and for the benefit of the dependant or dependants, or, as the case may be, for such other special purpose as aforesaid.

(2) Every married member shall, unless the Minister otherwise directs, allot from his pay for the benefit of the dependant or dependants referred to hereunder an annual amount being not less than the appropriate amount set out in the following scale:—

(3) Unless in the case of any member the Air Board otherwise directs, every member shall, from and including the date of his embarkation for service outside New Zealand, other than service on attachment to the Royal Air Force or to the Royal Canadian Air Force, allot from his pay to a dependant, trustee, attorney, responsible agent for business purposes, bank, financial institution, or accredited relative, or to a post-office savings-bank account in the name of the member at the Chief Post-office, Wellington, such amount (if any) as will preclude that member from drawing while outside New Zealand any pay in excess of the appropriate annual rate prescribed as applicable to that member, having regard to his branch, rank, and classification in the Fourth Schedule hereto. Every such allotment shall be in addition to any allotments made under the preceding provisions of this regulation.

VOLUNTARY ALLOTMENT

17. Except as otherwise provided in these regulations or as otherwise directed by the Minister, any member may allot any amount from his pay in favour of any person wholly or partly dependent upon him or for crediting to a post-office savings-bank account to be opened in his name at the Chief Post-office, Wellington.

MAXIMUM ALLOTMENTS

18. Notwithstanding anything in Regulation 16 or Regulation 17 hereof, no member shall, unless the Minister otherwise directs, allot or be required to allot or have deducted from his pay such sums as would in the aggregate, if deducted from his pay, reduce the balance of pay actually received by him to less than £45 per annum.

PAY DURING PRIVILEGE LEAVE BEFORE DISCHARGE

19. Any member, before being discharged, or on being posted to the Reserve for an indefinite period, may be granted by a commanding officer of a station or by any higher Air Force authority fourteen days' privilege leave on pay:

Provided that any member who served overseas and returned to New Zealand before the 19th day of April, 1944, may be granted twenty-eight days' privilege leave on pay instead of fourteen days as aforesaid.

LEAVE WITHOUT PAY

20. The Minister, or any other person authorized by the Minister in that behalf, may from time to time place any member on, or grant to any member, leave without pay.

QUARTERS AND RATIONS ALLOWANCE

- 21. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, where any member is not provided with free quarters and rations he shall be entitled to an allowance at the rate of 3s. per day—
 - (a) If he occupies Government quarters provided for married personnel where a rental is payable; or
 - (b) If he has been granted permission to live off a station; or
 - (c) If he is required to live where no service accommodation is available:

Provided that the said allowance may, subject to such conditions as may from time to time be determined by the Air Board, be increased to 4s. 6d. per day:

- (2) Where any member ordinarily resident at a station is for a period of not less than three consecutive days absent from his station on duty, recreational leave, special leave, or sick-leave not occasioned by the member's misconduct or neglect, he shall be entitled to an allowance at the rate of 3s. per day.
- (3) The allowance provided for in this regulation shall not be paid in respect of any period during which the member is temporarily attached to any other station where quarters and rations are provided or where travelling-allowance or actual and reasonable expenses are paid.

(4) In the case of any airman seconded for service in the Fleet Air Arm, the allowance provided for in subclause (1) of this regulation shall cease as from the date of such secondment:

Provided that the said allowance shall be paid to the airman for any period during which he is not rationed by one of His Majesty's

(5) In the case of any member receiving any sum by way of separation allowance under Regulation 14 hereof, the allowance payable under this regulation shall be reduced by an amount equivalent to the amount of the separation allowance being so received.

EMBARKATION-LEAVE ALLOWANCE

22. Before proceeding overseas, every member posted for service outside New Zealand shall be paid an embarkation-leave allowance of £3, and on any subsequent posting for such service a member may, if embarkation leave is granted, be paid an allowance of £2. No such member shall, during the first twenty-one days of his initial embarkation leave, or during the first fourteen days of any subsequent period of embarkation leave, be entitled to any allowance for quarters and rations.

Instrument Allowance

23. Where any member makes available and uses for Service purposes any instrument or instruments belonging to him, he may be paid an instrument allowance not exceeding £15 per annum in accordance with such scale and subject to such conditions as may from time to time be determined by the Air Board.

TOOL-KIT ALLOWANCE

24. A tool-kit allowance not exceeding 6d. per day may be paid to such airmen in such trades and subject to such conditions as may from time to time be determined by the Air Board.

FLYING-ALLOWANCE

25. Every airman, not being an airman mustered in an aircrew trade or under training as aircrew, shall be paid a flying-allowance of 2s. for each day on which he is required to make a duty flight in Service aircraft otherwise than as a passenger.

Uniform-upkeep Allowance to Officers

- 26. (1) Any officer while serving outside New Zealand, otherwise than on attachment to the Royal Air Force or to the Royal Canadian Air Force, may be granted a uniform-upkeep allowance of £10 per annum. An allowance so granted shall be paid quarterly in arrears and upon and subject to such conditions as may from time to time be determined by the Air Board.
- (2) The allowance payable under subclause (1) of this regulation shall be in addition to the allowance payable under Regulation 158 of the Royal New Zealand Air Force Regulations 1938.*

MUFTI ALLOWANCE

27. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, every temporary member upon discharge, or upon transfer to the Air Force Reserve for an indefinite period or to the Army for placing to an area pool on indefinite leave without pay, shall, if at the date of such discharge or transfer he has completed a period of service of not less than six months, be paid a mufti allowance of £10 increased by £2 10s. for each complete month of service in excess of the said six months:

Provided that the total amount of any allowance paid under this regulation shall not exceed in any case the sum of £25.

(2) The Air Board may from time to time prescribe conditions as to computation of service for the purposes of this regulation, and as to the scale of deductions which may be made from any such allowance as aforesaid to meet kit deficiencies.

FORFEITURE OF PAY AND ALLOWANCES

- 28. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, every member shall forfeit pay and allowances in accordance with and to the extent prescribed in the scale set out in subclause (2) of this regulation for every day—
 - (a) On which the member is in desertion or absent without leave:
 - (b) On which the member is in custody while under sentence of imprisonment, detention, or field punishment, awarded by a Civil Court, or by a court-martial, or by his commanding officer, or by the captain of one of His Majesty's ships:
 - (c) For which forfeiture of the member's pay has been awarded by court-martial or by his commanding officer.

- (2) The forfeiture of the standard or supplemented rate of pay of a member shall be in accordance with the following scale:—
 - (a) Where a member is serving within New Zealand—

(1) Occurrence.	(2) Unallotted Pay.	(3) Pay allotted, but not to a Dependant.	(4) Pay allotted and Domestic Allowance paid to a Dependant.

- (3) Where any member returns to New Zealand while subject to forfeiture of pay, the provisions of paragraph (a) of subclause (2) of this regulation shall apply on and from the date of disembarkation of the member.
- (4) Where any member not in receipt of a supplemented rate of pay is making an allotment of his pay to some person other than and not for the benefit of his wife, child, or divorced wife, such person shall not, for the purposes of this regulation, be deemed to be a dependant of the member unless the Minister otherwise directs.

(5) Any pay or allowances paid to any member for any period during which that member has forfeited such pay or allowances, and any allotted pay paid during such period as aforesaid which pursuant to subclause (2) hereof is to be recovered from that member, shall be recovered from the pay of that member immediately after the expiry of the period of forfeiture:

Provided that while such recovery is being made as aforesaid the member shall receive unallotted pay at a rate not less than £18 5s.

per annum.

STOPPAGE OF PAY

29. Subject to such conditions as may from time to time be prescribed by the Air Board, the pay of any member undergoing treatment for venereal disease shall be subject to a stoppage of 2s. per day.

DEFERRED PAY

30. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, every temporary member serving overseas and receiving the standard or supplemented rate of pay shall be paid deferred pay at the rate of 1s. for each day

of paid service outside New Zealand.

(2) Where any member serves on attachment to the Royal Air Force or the Royal Canadian Air Force there may, in respect of the period of such service, be paid to him as an annual rate of deferred pay the amount (if any) by which the annual rate of pay to which he would have been entitled had he not been so serving, together with the sum of £18 5s., exceeds the total of the annual rates of pay and dependants' allowances to which during that period he is entitled from the Force with which he is so serving:

Provided that in no case shall any amount paid to a member under

this subclause exceed the sum of £18 5s. per annum.

(3) Where any member serves on attachment to the Royal Air Force there may, in respect of the period of such service and in addition to any deferred pay to which he may be entitled under subclause (2) of this regulation, be paid to him as an annual rate of deferred pay the amount (if any) by which the annual rate of pay to which he would have been entitled had he not been so serving exceeds the total of the annual rates of pay and dependants' allowances to which during that period he is entitled from that Force.

(4) The deferred pay to which any member is entitled under subclause (1) or subclause (2) of this regulation may be paid to that member either on his ceasing to be employed on full-time service or after the termination of the war, or may, in the event of his death,

be paid to his estate.

(5) The deferred pay to which any member is entitled under subclause (3) of this regulation may be paid to him either on his demobilization or on his return to New Zealand, or may, in the event.

of his death, be paid to his estate.

(6) Where a member, while attached to the Royal Canadian Air Force, marries a resident of Canada and subsequently becomes attached to the Royal Air Force, there may be paid by way of subsidy to the wife of that member, so long as she remains in Canada, the amount by which the minimum allotment and allowances payable to the wife of an aircrew sergeant in the Royal Canadian Air Force exceeds the total of that member's qualifying allotment from his Royal Air Force pay and dependants' allowances payable by the Royal Air

Force at the appropriate rates. Any subsidy under this subclause shall be payable while the member remains attached to the Royal Air Force, and any amount so paid for any period shall be set off as a deduction against any deferred pay to which the member may be entitled under this regulation in respect of that period.

(7) For the purposes of this regulation the term "pay" shall be deemed to include such allowances as may from time to time be

determined by the Air Board.

(8) The provisions of this regulation, in so far as they apply in respect of members of the Air Force, may be extended to apply to such other person or persons as the Minister may from time to time direct.

PAY ON RECLASSIFICATION, REMUSTERING, OR PROMOTION

31. Evidence and notification of any reclassification, remustering, or promotion of an airman shall be of such nature as may from time to time be directed by Air Force or Air Department Order, and evidence and notification in accordance with any such Order shall be sufficient authority for any adjustment of pay consequent upon any such reclassification, remustering, or promotion.

Exemption of Pay and Allowances from certain Tax Deductions

32. No deduction for social security contribution or national security tax shall be made in respect of the pay and allowances payable to any member under these regulations.

Medical Examination of Recruits

- 33. Every person who, before becoming a member, is required by any Air Force authority to undergo medical examination, including x-ray examination and re-examination, shall be granted payments and concessions in accordance with the following scale:—
 - (a) Payment at the rate of 7s. 6d. per day for each day or part of a day on which he is necessarily absent from his usual place of residence:
 - (b) Free travelling warrants from his place of residence to the place of examination and return:
 - (c) Free lodging or a refund of the actual and reasonable cost of lodging where he is absent from his place of residence for at least one night:
 - (d) Free meals or a refund of the actual and reasonable cost of meals required while he is absent from his place of residence.

REMEDIAL TREATMENT OF RECRUITS

34. Every person in paid employment who, before becoming a member, is required by any Air Force authority to undergo medical remedial treatment which necessitates his absence from his employment and causes any loss of his earnings shall for the period of such absence be paid, if he is unmarried, at the minimum rate of pay for an unmarried member, and if he is married, at the minimum rate for a married member, or shall in either case be paid for such period as aforesaid at the gross rate, after deduction of social security contribution and national security tax, at which he is employed, whichever is the less:

Provided that there shall be deducted from any payment made under this regulation an amount equivalent to the amount of any payment which that person may receive or to which he may be entitled from any other source in respect of such remedial treatment as aforesaid.

FUNERALS

35. Where any member dies, a funeral at the public expense may be provided upon and subject to such conditions and in accordance with such scale as may from time to time be determined by the Air Board.

AIR DEPARTMENT ORDERS

36. Orders, commonly known as Air Department Orders, issued by the authority of the Air Board shall for all purposes be deemed to be Air Force Orders, and shall have full force and effect accordingly.
