PURSUANT to section 37 of the Racing Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. **Title**—This order may be cited as the Racing (Totalisator) Order 1973.

2. **Number of days on which totalisators may be used**—The aggregate number of days on which totalisators may be authorised to be used in any 1 racing year shall be 268 in respect of galloping clubs, 148 in respect of trotting clubs, and 17 in respect of hunt clubs.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order increases the number of days on which totalisators may be used by 14 in respect of galloping clubs and 15 in respect of trotting clubs.
