THE RACING (TOTALISATOR) ORDER 1978

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 7th day of August 1978

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 37 of the Racing Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Racing (Totalisator) Order 1978.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Number of days on which totalisator may be used—(1) The aggregate number of days on which totalisators may be authorised to be used in any 1 racing year shall be as follows:

(a) In respect of totalisator clubs—

(i) For galloping clubs, 290:

(ii) For trotting clubs, 182:

(iii) For hunt clubs, 17:

(b) In respect of restricted totalisator clubs—

(i) For galloping clubs, 10:

(ii) For trotting clubs, 10:

(iii) For greyhound racing clubs, 60.

(2) The Racing (Totalisator) Order 1977* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order fixes the number of days on which totalisators may be used.

There is no increase in the number of days available to totalisator clubs.

The number of days available to restricted totalisator clubs is fixed for the first time at 10 for galloping clubs, 10 for trotting clubs, and 60 for greyhound racing clubs.
