ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 21st day of October 1985

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 37 of the Racing Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Racing (Totalisator) Order 1985.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Total number of licences which may be issued—The combined total number of totalisator licences and restricted totalisator licences which may be granted to racing clubs in any racing year shall be 646.

3. Revocation and savings—(1) The Racing (Totalisator) Order 1983* is hereby revoked.

(2) Notwithstanding the revocation of the Racing (Totalisator) Order 1983, it shall continue to apply in respect of the racing year ending with the 31st day of July 1986.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order increases the combined total number of totalisator licences which may be granted to racing clubs in any racing year from 622 to 646, an increase of 24. It applies in respect of the racing year commencing on 1 August 1986 and subsequent racing years.
