EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order revokes the regulations which make it a condition of every warrant issued under the Broadcasting Act 1976 that the holder shall not broadcast any programme (being a programme for which payment is made) that promotes the consumption of alcoholic liquor.

The control, under the Broadcasting Act 1976, of advertising that promotes the consumption of alcoholic liquor reverts, as a result of this revocation, to rules made under section 26 of that Act.
