EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order revokes the Burial-ground Dedication Regulations 1940

Part I of those regulations (which prescribes the manner by which a denominational burial-ground may be established) is unnecessary.

Part II of those regulations (which prescribes the manner by which a private burial-ground may be established) is spent as the Burial and Cremation Act 1964 (which replaced the Cemeteries Act 1908) does not authorise the establishment of private burial-grounds.
