EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

The revoked orders prohibited the importation, except by special authority, of—

- (a) Live poultry:
- (b) Insects in their larval, pupal, and adult stages; spiders; scorpions; and the eggs of insects, spiders, and scorpions:
- (c) Any living animal:
- (d) Live fish, mollusc, crustacea, and amphibia:
- (e) The eggs of domestic fowls, ducks, geese, and turkeys.

These importations are now controlled by section 19A of the Stock Act 1908 as inserted by section 6 of the Stock Amendment Act 1952.
