EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. The rules revoked by this order prescribe Court fees in respect of proceedings under the Land Valuation Proceedings Act 1948. Those rules have been rendered redundant by the changes made to that Act last year by the Land Valuation Proceedings Amendment Act 1977. The only fees now payable in respect of proceedings under the Land Valuation Proceedings Act 1948 are the fees payable in respect of appeals to the Administrative Division of the Supreme Court. The fees applicable when this revocation takes effect on 31 July 1978 are to be the fees prescribed by the Supreme Court Fees Regulations 1975 (as amended by the Supreme Court Fees Regulations 1975, Amendment No. 1).
