EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 2 July 1997, disestablishes the 4 regional health authorities, namely—

- (a) The Northern Regional Health Authority:
- (b) The Midland Regional Health Authority:
- (c) The Central Regional Health Authority:
- (d) The Southern Regional Health Authority.

This order is consequent upon the establishment of the Transitional Health Authority (by S.R. 1997/57), and the transfer to it of all of the assets and liabilities of the 4 regional health authorities (by S.R. 1997/98).
