#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

1999/212

This order, which comes into force on 12 July 1999, revokes the Resource Management (Marlborough Sounds Coastal Tendering-Marine Farming) Order 1998. That order is expressed to expire on 11 July 1999, which is 1 year after the date on which it came into force. However, section 152 (5) of the Resource Management Act 1991 provides that such orders expire on the second anniversary of the date on which they come into force. This order is accordingly made to avoid any doubt as to the date on which the earlier order ceases to have effect.
