THE RATES OF WAGES EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 3

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of February, 1942.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rates of Wages Emergency Regulations 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting after clause 3 the following clause:—
- "3A. (1) In making any general order under these regulations the Court may exclude from the scope of the order such portion of the remuneration in each week of the workers affected by the order as exceeds an amount determined by the Court, which amount may be varied as the Court thinks fit in the case of female workers, junior workers, and apprentices respectively.

"(2) Where any such exclusion is made, any increase or reduction provided for by the order in the rates of remuneration shall apply to the unexcluded portion of the remuneration of each worker, irrespective of his total weekly remuneration.

"(3) For the purposes of this clause the term 'remuneration' means actual earnings, including time and piece wages and overtime and any other special payments."
