THE RADIO REGULATIONS 1953, AMENDMENT NO. 10

BERNARD FERGUSSON, Governor-General

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 28th day of March 1967

Present

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Radio Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1967.

2. (1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking clauses 1 to 13, and substituting the following clauses:

“1. For examinations for certificates under Part II—

“(a) First class radiotelegraph operator’s certificate	£3.
“(b) Second class radiotelegraph operator’s certificate	£2.
“(c) Radiotelegraph operator’s special certificate	£1.
“(d) General radiotelephone operator’s certificate	£1.
“(e) Restricted radiotelephone operator’s certificate	15s.
“(f) First class certificate in radiotechnology	£3.

“(g) Second class certificate in radio- technology	£2.
“(h) Endorsed certificate in radiotech- nology (reg. 95)	10s.
“(i) Restricted radiotelegraph operator’s certificate	£1.
“(j) Amateur operator’s certificate	£1.
“(k) First class radiotelegraph operator’s certificate, provided the candida- te has passed or obtained a partial pass in the examination for a second class radiotelegraph operator’s certificate	£2.
“(l) First class certificate in radiotech- nology, provided the candidate has passed the examination for a second class certificate in radiotechnology	£2.
“(m) Morse operating only	10s.
“2. For each examination paper in respect of which a recount of marks is undertaken	10s.
“3. For a radiotelephone operator’s permit	10s.
“3A. For an amateur high-frequency permit	5s.
“4. For a duplicate certificate or permit issued under Part II	10s.

“Licences

“5. For a ship station or aircraft station licence where the ship or aircraft is required by any enactment to be equipped with a radio transmitting installation	£5 per annum.
“6. For a ship station or aircraft station licence where the ship or aircraft is not required by any enactment to be equipped with a radio transmitting installation	£3 per annum.
“7. For a land station licence other than a short term licence of a ‘base’ or ‘mobile’ category	£3 per annum.
“8. For a short term land station licence of a ‘base’ or ‘mobile’ category	10s. for each station.
“9. For a citizen station licence	£1 10s. per annum.
“10. For a telecontrol station licence	£1 10s. per annum.
“11. For an experimental station licence	£3 per annum.
“12. For an amateur station licence	£1 10s. per annum.
“13. For a broadcasting station licence	£3 per annum.”

(2) Regulation 12 of the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 3, regulation 12 of the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 4, regulation 18 of the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 7, and regulation 42 of the Radio Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 9, are hereby revoked.

(3) Paragraphs (f), (g), (h), and (l) of clause 1 of the First Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by subclause (1) of this regulation) shall continue in force until the 1st day of April 1968, and shall then be deemed to be revoked.

3. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking clause 17, and substituting the following clause:

“17. For a duplicate of any licence 10s.”

4. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking clause 19, and substituting the following clause:

“19. For a paging station licence £1 10s. per annum.”

5. Where payment of a fee is made in respect of any entry for an examination for a certificate or permit to be held on or after the 1st day of April 1967 or payment of a fee in respect of a licence is made in respect of a period commencing on or after the aforesaid date (irrespective of the date of payment) the fee shall be the appropriate fee prescribed in the First Schedule to the principal regulations as amended by regulations 2 and 4 hereof.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the fees payable for the conduct of examinations for radio operators' certificates, and permits, and the fees payable in respect of certain licences.
